Ask them if they have ever heard the phrase before and, if so, see if they can explain what it means.

Inferring Causes and Effects Often when you read, you recognize a cause-and-effect relationship because the writer directly states that relationship. At other times, the relationships are less obvious, and you have to make an inference—an educated guess



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based on your own knowledge and experience—about the causes or the effects. The article on the next page deals with several cause-and-effect relationships. The writer directly states some; others are not as obvious.
